CALHOME GRANT APPLICATION FOR FIRST TIME HOME BUYERS

The Housing Division recently prepared and submitted a \$1,000,000 grant application to the State of California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) for funding under the CalHOME program for first time homebuyer assistance. During the Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Annual Plan consideration last Spring the Council identified increasing home ownership as a priority. As a result of that input staff prepared this application and is also working to funding home ownership classes under our HUD funding.

The proposed CalHOME grant would provide "gap" financing income qualified families in eligible census tracts. That gap can often cover down payment assistance, closing costs, and items. Funding is capped at 40% of the purchase price of the home. Typical funding is \$40,000 to \$65,000 per loan. There is a maximum loan amount of \$100,000.

The loan works as a "silent second." It remains as an obligation but payments, with interest, are deferred until after a first mortgage is paid off, typically 30 years. Should the home be sold or refinanced with cash out the loan become due and payable. Repayments that the City receives become "program income" which can be used for funding other eligible activities under the CalHOME Program. The City previously received awards in 2006 and 2012. Currently, we have 33 outstanding CalHOME loans with a balance of approximately \$1.1 million.

The requested grant will most likely allow the City to providing funding for up to 12 families. The City has an ongoing interest list which currently contains approximately 30 families. The City is also able to draw down administrative expenses for managing the grant and loans. Notice to the applicants is expected in June 2020.

HCD has indicated that it is likely to provide funding under CalHOME every two years. The City would likely be eligible to apply each time funding is made available. The program is competitive and not guaranteed.

RIBBON CUTTING AND GROUNDBREAKING CEREMONY HELD FOR CAMPUS PARKWAY

In January, local officials along side representatives from Merced County, Merced City, Merced County Association of Governments, Caltrans and UC Merced celebrated the ribbon-cutting for Campus Parkway Segment II and held the groundbreaking for Segment III near Highway 140. The \$30 million Segment II extends the four-lane expressway from East Childs Avenue to 1/4 mile past Highway 140. The new segment includes a traffic signal at Campus Parkway and East Childs Avenue, a concrete structure crossing the BNSF railroad tracks and Highway 140, and a traffic signal at the intersection of Highway 140 and the "Campus Parkway Access" connector road. This portion of the Campus Parkway Project was completed ahead of schedule.

The corridor is part of the regional plan to improve traffic circulation between Highway 99 and the UC Merced campus. Thanks to the leadership of Senator Anthony Cannella and Assembly Member Adam Gray, the Campus Parkway projected received \$100 million for construction under Senate Bill 132 which lawmakers passed in April of 2017.

The overall project consists of a four-lane divided roadway extending 4.5 miles from Mission Avenue to Yosemite Avenue. Segment I from Mission Avenue to East Childs Avenue was completed in 2009. The final segment is the largest portion of the project and will extend the expressway to Yosemite Avenue. The entire Campus Parkway Corridor project is anticipated to be complete by June 2023 at a total cost of \$100 million.

Measure V, Merced County's ½ cent transportation sales tax, was passed by Merced County voters with 71% approval in November 2016. Over the past year and a half, local jurisdictions have made steady progress on Measure V projects around the County. Recently, the City of Merced recently completed the Main Street and M Street Improvement Project. The project consisted of the reconstruction of both M Street and Main Street, between 18th Street to 16th Street and, N Street to M Street. Work included roadway pulverization, cement treatment, asphalt concrete, curb and gutter work, ADA ramps, concrete sidewalk, driveway approaches, traffic loops, and pavement modification.

Additional Measure V funded projects recently completed by the City of Merced include: reconstruction of M Street, from North Bear Creek Drive to Rambler Road.
