TRAUMA KITS ISSUED TO OFFICERS



This week, Merced Police Officers were issued trauma kits. These kits include items that officers can use to provide aid to victims of traumatic injuries. Through our partnership with RIGGS Ambulance Service, Paramedic Mike Garret provided training to our officers on the use of these kits. Mr. Garret works with the MPD SWAT as a Tactical Emergency Medic. The kits were made possible through funding provided by the U.S. Department Emergency Coronavirus of Justice Supplemental Funding Program.

Contracted tree pruning services continued this week, with West Coast Arborists working in the Bellevue CFD area.



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MERCED FIRE DEPARTMENT HAZARDOUS TEAM TRAINING

The pictures below depict the 11 members of the Merced Fire Department, trained to the level of Hazardous Materials Technician or Specialist, participating in a training scenario with the Merced County Hazardous Materials Team. The training scenario involved a simulated one-ton chlorine and H cylinder leaking inside a warehouse. Chlorine vapor or liquid is extremely dangerous and due to the immediately dangerous to life or health (IDLH) atmosphere it produces, it requires the highest level of personal protective equipment (PPE) by responding personnel. This level of protection requires responders to wear a self-contained breathing apparatus within the fully encapsulating level A suit. To contain the leak, a team of two personnel, in level A suits, entered the warehouse to locate the cylinder, identified the location and type of leak, and then applied the appropriate leak kit. This exercise is one of many which the Merced Fire Department conducts as part of their 24-hour annual recertification training.

E.1 21-145 Extension of Vesting Tentative Subdivision Map (VTSM) SUBJECT: #1291 (modified), initiated by Bright Development. This application involves a request for a one-year extension of time for filing a final map for VTSM #1291 (modified). VTSM #1291 (modified) would allow the subdivision of 39.8 acres of land into 161 single-family lots generally located on the east side of G Street at Merrill Place (extended) within an R-1-5 zone with a General Plan designation of Low Density Residential (LD). **PUBLIC HEARING**

SUMMARY

This is a request for a one-year extension of Vesting Tentative Subdivision Map (VTSM) #1291 (modified) for Bright Development. This subdivision would allow the construction of 161 single-family lots on 39.8 acres within an R-1-5 zone. The requested extension would extend the life of the map to January 16, 2022, per the Draft Modified Resolution at Attachment A.

RECOMMENDATION

Planning staff recommends that the Planning Commission approve the Extension of Vesting Tentative Subdivision Map (VTSM) #1291 to January 16, 2022.
