CLICK IT OR TICKET CAMPAIGN

"Click It or Ticket" is a National Highway Traffic Safety Administration campaign aimed at increasing the use of seat belts in the United States.

This year's Click It or Ticket campaign is from May 24th through June 6th. During this time, the Merced Police Department will actively look for drivers and passengers who are not wearing a seat belt. This includes drivers who do not secure children in child safety seats.

The National Highway Traffic Safety estimated nearly 15,000 lives were saved in 2017 due to seat belts.

PROJECT #120060 – N STREET IMPROVEMENTS, 16TH TO 18TH STREETS

The TBS Contractors, Inc. crew worked on demolition this week.

The project is approximately 10% in progress.



PROJECT #117020 – GERARD SEWER MAIN, HWY 99 TO KIBBY RD.

Rolfe Construction Co., Inc. crew is laying pipe.

This project is approximately 20% underway.



PROJECT #121053 – G STREET, PARK AVENUE TO BEAR CREEK, ROAD REHABILITATION

TBS Contractors installed 12" water main at the site. They are set for hydrostatic testing as of May 27th.

This project is approximately 50% complete.
