Cannabis Ordinance Changes & Updates

There were several cannabis ordinance changes at the November 4th Merced City Council Meeting. A second reading passed, and changes will take effect in 30 days.

- One retail cannabis dispensary license is available.
- Two new zones (Business Park and Thoroughfare Commercial) are allowed for retail cannabis businesses.
- Applications for a new retail cannabis business will be accepted starting in late fall/early winter of this year.
- Applications will be ranked based on merit-based criteria that have had additional points added for local ownership.
- Dispensaries are permitted to be open until 10 p.m.
