#### **107 FEET IN THE AIR!**

Imagine climbing a ladder that is 107 feet in the air. For some, this is an impossible task. However, firefighters can receive a call for this service at any time. Therefore, safe, and well-maintained equipment is critical. For this to happen, the department tests equipment annually. The department recently completed its annual ladder testing.

The metal square shown in the photo is 500 pounds, and as seen on the ground ladder test, it will cause the ladder to flex.

Aerial ladders are tested with weights attached to the end of the ladder to make sure the ladder can hold the weight that will be applied. These ladders are also tested by flowing water to ensure they can withstand pressures of up to 250 pounds per square inch. This annual testing and regular training are part of how the fire department is confident equipment is ready to do its job.

#### CAPTAIN ALAN WARD RETIRES AFTER 29 YEARS OF SERVICE! Thank you for serving the City of Merced

Captain Alan Ward was hired with Merced PD in October of 1993. As an Officer, he was assigned to Patrol, the Crisis Response Team (1994-2018), and the K9 Unit (1994-2018). Ward was promoted to the rank of Sergeant in 2006, where he supervised Patrol and the Disruptive Area Response, Team. Ward was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant in 2018, where he was assigned to the Operations Division and then the Administrative Division. In 2021 Ward was promoted to Captain, where he supervised the Administrative Division.

During his career with Merced Police Department, Ward handled two patrol dogs and worked with the K9 unit as a trainer and supervisor from 1996 to 2018. He was also a part of the Crisis Response Team from 1994-to 2018, with his final role on the team being the Team Commander.

Ward said the best assignment he held was being a Sergeant. Ward's favorite aspect of his job is in the front row of a great show watching our community and organization grow and mature over the years and feeling like he had a small part in it all.

After 29 years, Ward said he would miss the relationships and friendships of the incredible people in the city and police department the most. His advice for those just beginning their Law Enforcement career is to focus on the positive and keep your attention on what you want to accomplish.

Now that he's retired, Ward plans to take a breather and then jump back into public service in another capacity.



#### STEVEN STAYNER AND TIMOTHY WHITE PLAQUE

The Steven Stayner and Timothy White Plaque was stolen from its location. The two by 3-foot plaque was installed in 2010.

The police department is investigating. The City is working to replace the plaque as soon as possible.
