The Washburn Fire

On July 11th, the Merced City Fire sent a crew to the Washburn incident in Yosemite. The crew is part of an OES Type 6 strike team, 5802 F, which consists of crews from surrounding communities. Captain Tony Giotta, Engineer Scott Atkins, and Firefighter Adam Welsh will be on assignment for up to 21 days. During this time of year, the only way to effectively fight the wildfires we experience in CA is for departments across the state to send crews to help in areas of need. These coordinated efforts are part of the California Master Mutual Aid Plan.

On July 11th, 7/11, Merced Police Officers participated in 7- Eleven's Operation Chill, a program that provides a refreshing reward to stay cool.

For the 27th consecutive year, the chain partnered with local law enforcement agencies and provided coupons for free Slurpee drinks to be distributed to children in the community. This Community Outreach Program is designed to reduce crime and enhance relations between police and youth. Launched in Philadelphia in 1995, the Company's goal is to give law enforcement officers a positive way to interact with children and teens. In addition, the program aims to allow law enforcement officers to "ticket" kids they observe doing good deeds or exhibiting positive behavior.

Single Family Dwelling (SFD) permits:

- SFD Permits Issued: 1
- SFD Permits in Plan Review: **107**
- SFD Certificates of Occupancy: 27

Multi-Family Dwelling (MFD) permits in review:

- Gateway Terrace Apartments located at 405 W 12th St; one office/lounge and six two-story apartments: two buildings have 16 units, three buildings have 30 units, and one building has four units for a total of 126 units.
- Compass Pointe phase II: 112 units in 12, 8-plex buildings, plus a clubhouse.
- A fire damage repair is also adding an ADU located at 1740 Shirley St.
- Gateway Commons Apartments located at 3130 E. Gerard Ave.; one community building, five buildings with 16 units, and five buildings with 24 units for 200 units, plus 31 garage structures.
- A 2,324 SF duplex that was destroyed by a fire is being rebuilt at 3240 Nashville Ct.

MFD permits issued:

• 4, 8-plex buildings in the Compass Pointe phase II project listed above were issued during this period for a total of 32 units located on Horizons Ave and Pacific Dr.

Commercial & Industrial permits issued:

- There were 0 new construction commercial permits issued during this period.
- There were 2 new tenant improvement permits issued during this period; one for 1,348 SF for 2 retail spaces located at 1719 and 1723 N St., and one for a 4,930 SF Tioga Sequoia tap room located at 1707 N St.

Commercial & Industrial permits submitted:

- There was 1 new construction commercial permit submitted during this period; for a 914 SF shell for a future Starbucks located at 1993 W. Olive Ave.
- There were 2 new tenant improvement permits submitted during this period; one for a 3,332 SF office located at 3185 M St., and one for a 3,858 SF Quest Diagnostics located at 3377 G St. Ste A.

Commercial & Industrial Certificates of Occupancy (CofOs)

• There were 0 commercial and industrial CofOs issued for this period.
