DESCRIPTION

The Wastewater Treatment Plant provides treatment of all wastewater discharged through the sewer collection system.

MISSION

Protect the public health, the environment, and the waters of the State of California by providing appropriate wastewater treatment processes to all wastewater collected while monitoring and ensuring water discharged meets or exceeds State and Federal requirements.

GOALS

- Operate and maintain the City of Merced's Wastewater Treatment Plant in a reliable, safe, productive, and cost-efficient manner.
- Maintain compliance with State Water Resources Control Board National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permit requirements.
- Promote safety in the workplace through increased employee involvement, as well as taking full advantage of the industry's educational and technical programs, which are in compliance with Cal- OSHA and Fed- OSHA.

OBJECTIVES

 Continue to meet the requirements of the NPDES permit and Cease and Desist (C/D) order 5-00-247.

2005/2006 BUDGET HIGHLIGHTS

The plant expansion costs for engineering evaluation and design services are approximately \$7 million. The proposed plant expansion and upgrade estimate at this time is at least \$125-million. Council has approved the request to issue an Request for Proposal studying current user rates, facility charges, and impact fees to insure we have an adequate revenue stream in order to secure a bond for these projects.

The following positions has been recommended in the Fiscal Year 2005/2006 budget to support the continued growth of the city, and continually increasing regulatory requirements and demands:

- Instrumentation and Electrical Technician
- National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (split with the Environmental Control Division)
- Coordinator Water Resources Coordinator(split with the Environmental Control Division)
