I have to say as a parent participating in play group that I appreciate Mrs. Cari, & Mrs. Shavon's consistent energy and understanding of child development. There have been major milestones for my kiddo Gage's overall experiences in children's activities, events, groups, socialization, communications, understanding and physical ability. He continues to learn more and more, and I really contribute a great deal of it to the very specialized education you all provide for us as a family!

Today I believe Gage immediately established class as a safe space. Minutes into the room he took his own socks off and started to adjust and rub his feet onto the floor (Native American grounding to the environment ritual) he proceeded to make sure he spent time interacting and socializing with everyone in a way he had never before done (in a class setting, he is usually very observant and holds back) he almost made sure to give everyone some of his time.

He, for the first time on this level and at his own time started to initiate play touch and socialization with other kiddos at play group. He has never before outside of family and very close friends initiated this kind of contact, behavior or interaction he even went so far as to make contact with their hair which in our culture and in his teachings at home with me is a great very special honor (makes me feel he is in an environment where his culture is not shamed or ridiculed made me feel safe to discuss some of our beliefs - also makes me feel that him feeling safe and me feeling safe is us sharing another safe space with others outside of home or controlled environment and it feels very healing and helpful as a parent and mother).

Of course, upon making sure to try and accommodate never before boundaries that I felt needed to be made, I was immediately corrected in my "shaming" his exploration of socialization with other children (which I greatly appreciate and was given in a very thoughtful and informative way).

I write this rave about your wonderful staff and Gage's teachers and to you and all of your colleagues and programs to simply say you are all doing a wonderful job and thank you so much for holding a safe and inclusive space and environments where baby gauge can learn, grow explore and even teach.

It's really a privilege for us to be able to have access to such an interactive program it's so much appreciated!!! Thank you thank you all! So much for all you do!

Please let all of Gage's parent teachers & staff know they are a great irreplaceable resource in his life and his parents as well! I'm super excited for what gauges future ability holds in store for him especially again with so many major leaps of learning forward!
