Recently, Merced Police Department Interim Chief Craig Gundlach had the honor of swearing in two police officers, Jorge Esparza-Sanchez, Leon Herr, and Reserve Officer Anna Callente.

Officer Esparza-Sanchez is from Alisco, Mexico. He earned his Associate Degree in Administration of Justice and Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice. Esparza-Sanchez graduated from Fresno City College Police Academy. He worked as a Correction Officer at Stanislaus Sheriff's Department and the Dos Palos Police Department until joining Merced PD.

Officer Herr is from Merced. He earned his bachelor's degree in criminal justice from Sacramento State. Before joining the Merced Police Department, Herr was a manager at AutoZone and worked as a private security officer at E & J Gallo Winery. Additionally, Herr was a member of Merced's Explorer Program. Officer Herr is the first member of his family to pursue a career in law enforcement.

WHAT'S HAPPENING AT THE APPLEGATE ZOO

The Applegate Zoo has had a busy spring. The zoo has been hosting Merced and Stanislaus County schools, teaching students about the animals living at the zoo and the importance of rescue and conservation. Students have enjoyed visiting the animals, petting the tortoises, and feeding the goats. More than 300 students and teachers visited in April, while another 700 are expected through May. The zoo is an affordable, fun field trip for schools and has seen a significant increase in student visits in the past two years.

Meanwhile, long-time Lead Zookeeper Donna McDowell retired in April after almost 30 years of service. Donna began her career as a volunteer, became a temporary employee, took a full-time position, and worked her way to Lead Zookeeper. In her tenure, Donna oversaw hundreds of animals. She raised animals from infancy, including the beloved mountain lion Mac, and nursed sick and injured zoo residents back to health. Donna also spearheaded efforts to beautify the zoo and make it a destination where visitors could come and sit to enjoy the landscape and the animals. In 1988, AWWA brought Drinking Water Week to the attention of the U.S. Government and formed a coalition along with the League of Women Voters, the Association of State Drinking Water Administrators, and the US Environmental Protection Agency.

Rep. Robert Roe and Sen. Dennis DeConcini subsequently sponsored a resolution to name the first week of May as Drinking Water Week, and the week-long observance was declared in a joint congressional resolution signed by then President Ronald Reagan.
