#### **Get Involved**



The Merced County region is developing a multi-jurisdictional housing element (MJHE) for the sixth cycle housing element update. Jurisdictions participating in the joint effort are the County of Merced and the cities of Atwater, Dos Palos, Gustine, Livingston, Los Banos, and Merced. The Housing Element is a policy document that provides a comprehensive strategy for promoting the production of available, affordable, and adequate housing within the Merced Region.

To ensure that the Housing Element includes policies that represent the values and ideas of the cities' diverse populations, residents and community members are encouraged to participate in a 10-minute survey. To access the survey, visit <u>https://mercedmjhe.com/get-involved/</u>.

#### **Housing Element**

The MJHE is a policy document that provides a comprehensive strategy for promoting the production of available, affordable, and adequate housing within the community. It serves as a strategy to address housing needs across the economic and social spectrum. State law requires that cities and counties update their housing elements every eight years. The Housing Element will cover the period of January 31, 2024, to January 31, 2032. The California Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) must certify the Housing Element by a pre-determined deadline, February 18, 2024, for Merced County.

#### What is a Housing Element?

The Housing Element is a comprehensive assessment of current and future housing needs for all residents of Atwater, Dos Palos, Gustine, Livingston, Los Banos, Merced, and Merced County, as well as programs for meeting those needs. The primary focus of the Housing Element is to ensure decent, safe, sanitary, and affordable housing for current and future residents of unincorporated areas, including those with special needs.
