#### FIRE DEPARTMENT ROPE RESCUE TRAINING

Over the last three weeks, Merced Fire conducted two 40-hour rope rescue courses for department members. Each course meets national standards under NFPA 1670 and 1006 requirements for Technical Rope Rescue Operations & Technicians.

These courses focus on foundational skills and progress to higher technical rope rescue capabilities. Topics covered were rigging systems, incident management, high-angle rescue systems and associated hazards, critical thinking, and implementation of victim access options and rescue transport options.

- Compass Pointe phase II: 112 units in 12, 8-plex buildings, plus a clubhouse located at Compass Pointe Ave, Stinson Dr., and Horizons Ave. **2 buildings still in review**.
- Affordable housing located at 3015 Park Ave.; 57,812 SF 3 story new construction, including a 2,744 SF community building. The project will provide 65 1 bedroom, 1 bathroom units and a single 2 bedroom, 1 bathroom unit.
- Two 1,336 SF duplexes located at 103 and 107 R St.
- A 4,624 SF 4-plex located at 1125 H St.
- A 2,600 SF duplex located at 531 Childs Ave.

MFD permits issued:

• There were 3 multi-family permits issued during this period; one for a 2,687 SF triplex located at 953 W 18<sup>th</sup> St., and 2- 8 plex buildings for Compass Pointe Phase II located at 3664 and 3682 Compass Pointe Ave.

Commercial & Industrial permits issued:

- There was 1 new construction commercial permit issued during this period; for the 4,182 SF clubhouse at Compass Pointe Apartments, located at 3786 Horizons Ave.
- There were 2 new tenant improvement permits issued during this period; one for a 19,172 SF remodel at Autozone located at 1158 W Main St., and one for a 30,000 SF remodel at Walmart located at 3055 Loughborough Dr.

Commercial & Industrial permits submitted:

- There were 0 new construction commercial permits submitted during this period.
- There were 0 new tenant improvement permits submitted during this period.
