## Meet Applegate Lead Zookeeper Josh Moreno

Parks and Community Services proudly announces the promotion of Josh Moreno to the position of Lead Zookeeper at Merced's Applegate Zoo.

Josh has an extensive history with Applegate Zoo. His passion for animal rescue and care started at a young age through an occasional visit. In high school, Josh spent as much time as his schedule permitted volunteering at the zoo.

After formally committing to the field through higher education, he left the area to work for Fresno's Chaffee Zoo. Eventually, there was an opportunity for Josh to return to Applegate Zoo in a full-time capacity. He worked directly with former Lead Zookeeper Donna McDowell and the Merced Zoological Society for several years.

Josh deeply respects the animals under the zoo's care and understands the responsibility to rescue native species while educating our community.

In his new role, Josh has initiated substantial changes to the zoo, including new animal acquisitions. Look out for the Great Horned Owl coming soon.

Additional updates include exciting new guest experiences, such as a new Docent Program where guests are encouraged to get close and personal with furs, fossils, and eggs of various species of animals, and new exhibit upgrades, such as renovations to the big pond area to reflect the wetlands and species found at the Merced and San Luis National Wildlife Refuge(s).

Josh brings a fresh perspective on the zoo's potential and a deep passion for its residents and the Merced community. We are excited to have him lead our efforts at Merced Applegate Zoo.

#### CALL FOR WAHNETTA HALL TRUST FUND APPLICATIONS

CITY OF MERCED

The Wahnetta Hall Trust Fund was established in 1995. Provisions of the Trust require the City of Merced to use a portion of the endowment fund to establish and maintain a mini-train system and band concert program in Applegate Park.

The Merced City Council annually approves the disbursement of funds to qualified nonprofit organizations that meet eligibility criteria and can perform the services as described in the Trust.

This year \$2,395 is available for distribution. Past recipients have included the Kiwanis Club of Greater Merced for the mini-train operation and the Merced County Regional Arts Council, Merced Symphony Association, and Merced Community Band for concerts at the Merced Open Air Theater in Applegate Park.

The application deadline for 2023 funding is Friday, September 15, 2022. Nonprofit organizations interested in applying should submit a letter of request to the Office of Parks and Recreation, 678 W. 18th Street, Merced, CA 95340, attention Michelle Reid, Recreation Supervisor. Electronic submission and hard copies will be accepted.

The Housing Element directs locations for new housing and includes policies to support:

- New housing development
- Preservation and rehabilitation of existing housing
- Affordable housing
- Homeownership opportunities
- Emergency shelters and supportive/transitional housing
- Housing for seniors, students, farmworkers, and people with disabilities
