Eric Berlier, David Soto, and Renee Aguirre from the Public Works Refuse Department competed in the 2023 Solid Waste Association of North America (SWANA) California Road-E-O on August 26th. David Soto took first place in the Side Loader Competition, and Eric Berlier took first place in the Front Loader Competition.

Eric also received the Top Gun Award, scoring the highest total points in all three categories. Eric and David are invited to compete in the SWANA International Road-E-O on October 14th. This is not Eric's first Road-E-O victory; in 2018, Eric won First Place in the Front Loader Competition and overall "Grand Champion" at the International SWANA competition.

## MERCED GANG & NARCOTIC INVESTIGATIONS

THE MERCED POLICE DEPARTMENT ESTABLISHED THE GANG VIOLENCE SUPPRESSION UNIT IN 1990. THIS UNIT WAS CREATED TO HELP TARGET AN INCREASE IN GANG RELATED CRIME WITHIN THE CITY AND COUNTY OF MERCED.

THE GVSU IS CURRENTLY COMPRISED OF 4 OFFICERS AND 1 SERGEANT. THEY ARE TASKED WITH SEVERAL DUTIES INCLUDING FOLLOWING UP ON A VARIETY OF CRIMES REPORTED BY CITIZENS IN THE COMMUNITY. THEY PROACTIVELY PATROL KNOWN GANG AREAS, THEY GATHER INTELLIGENCE ON LOCAL GANGS, AND THEY TESTIFY AS GANG EXPERTS IN COURT. THE GVSU WORKS WITH MANY OTHER AGENCIES WITHIN THE CENTRAL VALLEY TO SOLVE AND STOP MANY OF THESE CRIMES.

THE GVSU HAS BEEN ASSIGNED TO FOLLOW UP ON APPROXIMATELY 180 CASES IN 2023. MANY OF THESE CASES ARE VIOLENT CRIMES SUCH AS ROBBERIES, CAR JACKINGS, SHOOTINGS AND ASSAULTS. IN 2023 THE GVSU HAS SERVED NEARLY 80 SEARCH WARRANTS RESULTING IN THE ARREST OF 130 SUSPECTS. THESE SEARCHES HAVE ALLOWED OFFICERS TO RECOVER 78 FIREARMS, APPROXIMATELY 3,000 FENTANYL PILLS AND NEARLY 12 POUNDS OF VARIOUS NARCOTICS.

## City of Merced First Responder Fee Community Outreach Project

A first responder is someone whose job is to be one of the first to arrive at an emergency. This person can be a paramedic, firefighter, or police officer. These individuals have specialized training to provide assistance or incident resolution, such as stabilizing a patient, controlling a fire, or securing a crime scene.

When you call 911, different levels of first responders come to your aid. Firefighters and police officers can give basic first-aid care and CPR for adults, children, and infants. Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs) can do more than first responders. They may help patients who have trouble breathing with oxygen and equipment. Paramedics have high-level training to give certain life-saving medications and can place breathing tubes to help people having difficulty breathing and can use defibrillators.

You will NOT receive a bill for fires, public assist requests, life assists, etc. You will receive a bill if the City of Merced Fire Department responds to a request for medical first response and care is rendered.

All public records relating to an open session item that are distributed to a majority of the Commission will be available for public inspection at the Planning Division Office during regular business hours. The Planning Commission also serves as the Board of Zoning Adjustment and the Design Review/Historic Preservation Commission.

#### PUBLIC COMMENT: OBTAIN SPEAKER CARD FROM THE CLERK

Members of the audience who wish to address the Planning Commission are requested to complete a speaker card available at the podium at the back of the Council Chamber. Please submit the completed card to the Clerk before the item is called, preferably before the meeting begins. Speakers will be called up, 3 to 5 at a time, in the order in which the forms are received. Please use the microphone and state your name and city of residence for the record. For permits, licenses, and other entitlements, the applicant will be allowed 15 minutes (including rebuttal), the appellant/leader of the opposition will be allowed 15 minutes (including rebuttal), and all other speakers shall have 5 minutes each, unless the number of speakers is over 3, which in that case, comments shall be limited to 3 minutes each. For all other issues, for 3 or less speakers, 5 minutes each and for over 3 speakers, 3 minutes each shall be allotted. A timer clock is located above the City Council dais illuminating the remaining time. Once the buzzer sounds, please be courteous and conclude your remarks.

Material may be emailed to planningweb@cityofmerced.org and should be limited to 300 words or less. Please specify which portion of the agenda you are commenting on, for example, Item # or Oral Communications. Your comments will be presented to the Planning Commission at the appropriate time. Any correspondence received after 1 PM will be distributed to the Planning Commission and retained for the official record.

23-730 **SUBJECT:** Sign/Zoning Ordinance Amendment #23-04, initiated by the City of Merced. This application involves repealing Chapter 17.36 -Signs from the Merced Municipal Code and replacing Chapter 20.62 -Signs in its entirety with a comprehensive update to the ordinance that would place all sign regulations in one chapter, bring the Sign Ordinance into compliance with recent court rulings, and make the sign requirements consistent throughout the City. The new ordinance would include new definitions, new regulations for sign area, temporary signs, digital/LED signs, signs in the public right-of-way, billboards, regional signs, freeway signs, and various other sign regulations. The proposed sign ordinance would categorize signs into four main types: permanent building signs, permanent freestanding signs, temporary building signs, and temporary freestanding signs. Each type of sign would be regulated by quantity, size, shape, type of illumination and location. \*\*PUBLIC HEARING\*\*]

#### SUMMARY

The proposed ordinance amendment is a comprehensive update of the Sign Ordinance which includes repealing the existing Sign Ordinance in Chapter 17.36-Signs of the Merced Municipal Code (MMC) and adding new sections to Chapter 20.62-Signs. This update is intended to make the Sign Ordinance less confusing and easier to interpret as well as bringing the ordinance into compliance with recent Supreme Court rulings.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Planning staff recommends that the Planning Commission recommend approval to the City Council of Environmental Review #23-27 (Categorical Exemption) and Zoning Ordinance Amendment #23-04 subject to the findings/considerations in Exhibit A and as described in the Draft Ordinance at Exhibit B of the Draft Resolution at Attachment A of Planning Commission Staff Report #23-730.

E.2 23-737 SUBJECT: Adoption of a Resolution of Denial for Conditional Use Permit #1272, initiated by Paramjeet Singh, on behalf of Encina Investment Group Mainplace Merced, LLC, property owner. This application involves a request for alcohol sales (beer, wine, and distilled spirits) for off-site consumption for a new convenience market at 429 W. Main Street, generally located on the north side of Main Street, approximately 75 feet east of Canal Street, with a General Plan designation of Regional/Community Commercial (RC), and a Zoning classification of Central Commercial (C-C)
