#### **Congratulations Captain Joey Perez**

This week, Police Chief Steven Stanfield had the honor of promoting Lieutenant Joey Perez to Captain.

Captain Perez's journey with the city began in September 2002 when hired as a police officer trainee, sponsored through the academy. With a commendable five-year tenure on patrol, followed by another five years in the Gang Unit (earning the Stephan Gray Gang Officer of the Year award in 2012), Captain Perez has consistently demonstrated excellence.

Perez played a pivotal role in founding the DART unit, contributing many years to its success. He then spent three years as a detective and was promoted to sergeant in April 2018, which marked a significant milestone. During this time, Perez oversaw patrol and supervised the Gang Unit while dedicating a decade to the PD Bomb Squad.

Perez's promotion to lieutenant in May 2021 brought administrative responsibilities, where he oversaw key units such as detectives, the Gang Unit, Records, Dispatch, and the professional standards unit.

Now, with the well-deserved promotion to captain, the focus shifts to operations and additional administrative duties, showcasing a rich and diverse career dedicated to public service.
