#### **Public Works in Action**

#### Growing the City's Urban Forest

The Public Works Trees crews are set to plant a total of 330 plants and trees, which will include varieties such as lavender, star jasmine, jack sprat, crepe myrtle, and Chinese Pistache. These green additions will be distributed across several districts, namely: Sequoia Hill, Lowes, Compass Point, Provance, Yosemite Gateway, Village Landing, Mansionette, and Silverado.







#### **Public Works Hosts SLEWS Program**

This week, Merced High School FFA students took part in the Student and Landowner Education and Watershed Stewardship or SLEWS program, where hands-on learning meets environmental stewardship.

In collaboration with the California Department of Fish and Wildlife, and the City of Merced - Home, The Merced FFA students engage in habitat restoration projects, planting native trees and shrubs, building irrigation systems, and participating in ecological field studies.

These immersive experiences foster an understanding of the land and introduce students to potential careers in natural resource management and environmental science.
