Welcome Juniper the Red Fox to Applegate Zoo

Meet Juniper the Red Fox, who joined the Applegate Zoo after being rescued from the Gold Country Wildlife Center. At only 12 weeks old, Juniper was discovered inside a chicken coop. The chickens' owner debated releasing her far from their coop, but given her tender age, they feared she wouldn't survive without her mother. Consequently, the California Department of Fish and Wildlife intervened and transferred Juniper to the rescue center. Since she was too young to be on her own and red foxes are non-native to California, the rescue center reached out to us, and we gladly welcomed Juniper into her forever home.





Environmental Education Display: Wastewater Treatment and Habitat Restoration at the Merced County Fair

The City of Merced Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) was the main display in the Tioga Hall building of the Merced County Fair this year. At the request of Candace Sigmond, Education Coordinator for Grassland Environment Education Center for Grassland Water District & CA Dept of Fish & Wildlife, the Water Quality Control Division was tasked to create a display depicting the Wastewater Treatment Plant and the processes involved in treating wastewater to useable resource.

One major useable resource is discharging treated wastewater, also known as recycled water, to the Wildlife Management Area (WMA). The WMA is located behind the WWTP and serves as a preserve for local wildlife and waterfowl habitat. The recycled water is discharged into two large ponds, creating wetlands, which help to provide suitable conditions for diverse organisms to thrive. Candace took a special interest in the WMA. She coordinated with Bill Osmer and Charles Slagter to bring Merced High School Future Farmers of America to the WMA to educate them on wetland habitat and management practices in restoring the habitat. Candace partners with the Student and Landowner Education in Watershed Stewardship (SLEWS) Program to provide this education in habitat restoration. This coordinated effort, in turn, brought about the reason for the display at the Fair. -continued on next page...

The display is about 20 feet long and 8 feet tall, consisting of 3 large illustrative posters of the WWTP, the WMA, and the Land Application Area, as well as a miniature model of each area. The model was created using multiple media including, but not limited to, woodworking, metalworking, acrylic, enamel, crafting supplies, and even some 3-D printing. Constructing the model was a group effort. Credits go to Beth Ball (master visionary), along with the skillful hands of Dylan Ford and Jeremy Geiger. Christina Yanez-Davison also assisted in painting and fun decorative aspects. Michelle Cadiente assisted in painting and staining the model bases. Vinyl labeling and 3-D printing credits go to Adam Purslow and Jeff Silva. We hope you had an opportunity to see the display in person at the Fair. The miniature model will be set up in the Water Quality Control Division office. If you have a moment, please come by!
