City of Merced Announces HCD Homekey Award for Innovative Housing Project

The City of Merced has received an \$11.15 million award from the HCD Homekey program for the Homekey CC915 Merced Phase 2 project, which will create 58 permanent supportive housing units for homeless and chronically homeless individuals with incomes at 30% or less of the Area Median Income (AMI). Located at 125 E. 13th Street, the project will include studios, one-bedroom, and two-bedroom units, employing sustainable building methods using shipping containers or modular structures. Local agencies have pledged substantial support, including land donation, enforceable funding commitments, and rental subsidies, while residents will benefit from nearby amenities like public transportation, grocery stores, medical clinics, and parks. Mayor Matthew Serratto emphasized the project's significance in addressing homelessness and providing essential housing and services for the community's most vulnerable members.
