Bear Creek Restoration Project

Earlier this week, City Manager Scott McBride spoke with ABC 30 about the Bear Creek restoration project, emphasizing the City's dedication to repairing the damage from the 2023 storms. Bear Creek suffered significant damage, impacting paths and overall safety. Initially, the City had planned to address invasive plants, but the project has now expanded to include essential storm-related repairs.

Dokken Engineering is leading the restoration efforts, which will take about 18 to 24 months. To keep the community informed, the City plans to host a series of community meetings as the project progresses. These meetings will keep residents informed about the work being done to restore and enhance Bear Creek for the benefit of all.

The City of Merced is looking for community input and suggestions on priorities throughout the city to create qualifying projects for the next application round due on October 11, 2024.

Eligible Projects Include:

- Active Transportation (Bicycle & Pedestrian) Projects, such as new sidewalks, new bicycle paths, etc.
- Traffic Signal Synchronization
- Certain Traffic Flow Improvements (roundabouts, auxiliary turn lanes separating turning traffic from through traffic, etc.)
- Alleyway Paving (minimum vehicle trip per day is 25)
- Alternative fueling/EV infrastructure
