Employee Spotlight: Leah Brown Management Analyst, Development Services

Say Hi to Leah Brown, the heart behind affordable housing in Merced.

Leah's been part of the City for over 21 years and with the Development Services Department for nearly three years (and counting!) and is on a mission to bring more affordable housing to Merced.

If you've seen new housing projects popping up around town, chances are Leah's been working on them and is dedicated to expanding housing opportunities for everyone in our community.

Why does Leah love her job? "I love being part of projects that make a difference. We've all seen people living in parks, under bridges, and around our neighborhoods. These projects aren't just about building homes—they're about giving people a real shot at stability. The more affordable units we create, the more we help folks avoid or escape homelessness. And no, these aren't shelters—they're permanent homes that provide real support!" So, what's Leah been working on lately? Here are some projects she's excited about:

Bella Vista Apartments – Coming in early 2025! Bella Vista is going to bring 108 brand-new apartments to Merced, with a mix of 1-, 2-, and 3bedroom units. And it's not just about the housing there will be live-in managers, a community center, Head Start childcare, a computer lab, a teen center, two playgrounds, and even a basketball court.

CC915 Veterans Village – This one's close to Leah's heart. CC915 is a 21-unit container village for veterans, complete with on-site management and supportive services from partners like the Merced Rescue Mission, the County, and the Veterans Administration. And get this—it's set to be finished by the end of this year.

Devonwood Apartments – If you've driven by Devonwood Dr behind Lowe's, you've probably noticed the construction. That's 156 new apartments going up! These will offer a mix of 1-, 2-, and 3bedroom units for families and individuals earning 80% or below the median income, with completion expected in 2025.

Best part? All of these projects come with 55-year deed restrictions, meaning they'll stay affordable for decades, no matter what.

Leah's passion for making Merced a better place shows in every project she touches. We're lucky to have her leading the charge in bringing more affordable housing to our community.
