New Red-Light Camera Safety Program Set to Launch

The City of Merced is launching a new automated red-light camera safety program to reduce reckless driving and improve street safety. Two cameras have been installed at the intersection of 16th Street and R Street, with a 30-day warning period beginning the week of April 21.

During this time, drivers will receive warnings—not citations—for running red lights or failing to stop fully before turning right. Citations will begin after the warning period ends. This program, administered in partnership with Verra Mobility, aims to curb dangerous driving behavior and make Merced's streets safer for all.

Willow Haven Homekey Project Breaks Ground in Merced

Recently, City and County officials, along with members of the community, were invited by the developer to take part in the groundbreaking ceremony for the Willow Haven Homekey Project, located at 125 E. 13th Street—a previously vacant lot soon to become a site of hope and stability.

This project will bring 58 new housing units, including one dedicated unit for an on-site manager, to serve individuals experiencing homelessness and chronic homelessness. The development is made possible through an \$11.1 million Homekey grant, awarded through a partnership between the City of Merced and the project's developer.

Willow Haven is one of seven affordable housing projects the City is actively supporting in collaboration with developers—some currently under construction, others in planning or development. Construction on Willow Haven is expected to begin in summer 2025.

As part of the CMAQ (060) Parkwest & McGregor Sidewalk Project, concrete crews are actively working along Home Avenue and McGregor Street. Meanwhile, demolition crews are clearing the way on Home Avenue east of R Street by grinding down tree stumps to prepare for new sidewalk installation.



Yosemite Ave Road Reconstruction: G Street to Parsons Ave

Rolfe Construction has mobilized their crew to begin work on the Yosemite Avenue Road Reconstruction project, from G Street to Parsons Avenue. The team is currently testing the sewer capacity, with full construction set to begin on Monday following a brief delay due to a misunderstanding with USA (Underground Service Alert).



Bob Hart Square Expansion: Water Main Installation Underway

Crews are currently working on installing the new water main as part of the Bob Hart Square Expansion project. During this phase of construction, traffic is being rerouted to ensure safety and minimize disruptions.



Childs Multi-Use Path: Progress Update and Ongoing Work
