Merced Fire Department Combines Wildfire Training with Ecological Restoration at Wastewater Facility

The Merced Fire Department conducted live fire wildland training exercises on June 23, June 26, and will continue on July 1 at the City of Merced Wastewater Treatment Plant. The training took place on more than 100 acres behind the facility and served a dual purpose: providing critical hands-on experience for firefighters and supporting fuel reduction and wetlands rehabilitation efforts.

During the exercises, crews practiced building control lines using prescribed burns and other fuel management techniques commonly used in wildfire response. This work supports the City's ongoing partnership with the California Department of Fish and Wildlife, which monitors local waterfowl populations year-round. As part of the site's habitat enhancement efforts, wood duck nesting boxes are also maintained throughout the area. This multi-benefit project not only prepares fire crews for wildfire season but also contributes to ecological restoration and risk reduction in a vital natural habitat.







A big thank you to our dedicated pool managers and lifeguards for keeping our kids safe!




Junior Giants Season Kickoff
