Included in this glossary are definitions for line-item accounts with similar expenditure patterns regardless of the department or fund. To reduce the necessity of multiple identical explanations, these "standard" justifications will apply to all identified line items and will not be repeated in each budget unit. Explanations in each budget unit are to describe particular or unusual entries.

Personnel Services

501001	Regular Salaries – Wages paid biweekly exclusive of fringe benefits. Compensation for employees who have received Post Certification, and shift differential pay for employees who are regularly scheduled to work outside of normal business hours is paid in addition to regular salaries.
501002	Extra Help – Hourly wages paid to temporary part time employees.
501003-4	Regular Overtime/Overtime Station Staffing - Pay for hours worked in excess of normal work hours.
501005	Regular Court Overtime - Pay for hours subpoenaed to appear in court outside of normal work hours.
501006	OES Contingency - Compensation to employees who are deployed or provide backfill to those who are deployed on mutual aid reimbursable incidents.
501007	Call Back Time Worked – Pay for eligible employees on standby who are called back to work as indicated in the respective MOU's.
501100	Acting Pay – Compensation to eligible employees who temporarily fill a higher paying position as indicated in the respective MOU's.
501101	Bilingual Pay Program - Compensation to employees who provide translation services.
501102	Canine Handlers Pay - Employees who are assigned canine responsibilities for time spent off duty are compensated an additional amount as indicated in the respective MOU's.
501103	Crime Scene Response Team Assignment - Employees who are assigned to the Crime Scene Response Team are compensated an additional amount as indicated in the respective MOU's.
501104	D.A R T. Assignment - Employees who are assigned to the Disruptive Area Response Team are compensated an additional amount as indicated in the respective MOU's.
501105	Defensive Tactics Instructor Pay - Employees who conduct defensive tactics training are compensated an additional amount as indicated in the respective MOU's.
501106	Dispatcher Training Pay - Employees who are assigned by the Police Chief or designee to train a newly hired probationary Dispatcher are compensated an additional amount as indicated in the respective MOU's.
501107	Education Incentive Pay -Employees who have completed a degree program are compensated at rates indicated in the respective MOU's.

- 501108 Field Training Officer Pay –Employees who have been assigned to Field Training Officer duty are compensated an additional amount per month as indicated in the respective MOU's.
- 501109 G.V.S.U. Assignment Employees who are assigned to the Gang Violence Suppression Unit are compensated an additional amount as indicated in the respective MOU's.
- 501110 Investigative Pay –Employees who have been assigned to Investigative Duty are compensated an additional amount as indicated in the respective MOU's.
- 501111 M.J.G.T.F. Assignment Employees who are assigned to the Multi-Jurisdictional Gang Task Force are compensated an additional amount as indicated in the respective MOU's.
- 501112 M.M.N.T.F. Assignment Employees who are assigned to the Merced/Mariposa Narcotics Task Force are compensated an additional amount as indicated in the respective MOU's.
- 501113 Standby Pay Compensation to employees who are required to be available for possible callback work during their off-shift hours.
- 501114 SWAT Duty and Bomb Unit Pay Employees who have been assigned to SWAT duty or to the Bomb Unit are compensated an additional amount per month as indicated in the respective MOU's.
- 501115 Hostage Negotiation Team Employees who are assigned to the Hostage Negotiation Team are compensated an additional amount as indicated in the respective MOU's.
- 501116 A.R.C.O.N. Duty Employees assigned to A.R.C.O.N. Duty are compensated an additional amount as indicated in the respective MOU's.
- 501117 Drone Duty Employees assigned to Drone Duty are compensated an additional amount as indicated in the respective MOU's.
- 501118 Tactical Dispatcher Duty Employees assigned to Tactical Dispatcher Duty are compensated an additional amount as indicated in the respective MOU's.
- 501119 Senior Sgt. Differential Pay Eligible employees at the top salary step receive additional pay as indicated in the respective MOU's.
- 501120 Range Master Duty Employees assigned to Range Master Duty are compensated an additional amount as indicated in the respective MOU's.
- 501121 Longevity Pay Employees who work for the city for the designated years of service receive additional compensation as indicated in the respective MOU's.
- 501123 Apparatus Operator Pay Firefighters assigned to operate the fire apparatus in the absence of a Fire Engineer are compensated an additional amount as indicated in the respective MOU's.

- 501124 POST Pay Employees who have obtained POST certificates are compensated at rates indicated in the respective MOU's.
- 502001 Holiday Pay Pay for working on City designated holidays. The city designates 13 paid holidays per calendar year. Many municipal employees work in positions that require manning 24 hours per day, 365 days a year.
- 502002 Unused Sick Leave Employees are paid annually 50 percent of any accrued sick leave over an established maximum at their straight time rate.
- 502003 Earned Benefits Pay to regular full-time City employees for accruals pursuant to appropriate agreements or upon separation from employment.
- 502004 Cash Back Bi-Weekly Allowance- The amount paid to an employee when their health and welfare insurance coverage has been waived.
- 503001 Clothing Allowance The City provides uniforms for those employees who are required to wear them, pursuant to negotiated agreements.
- 503002 Allowance for use of personal vehicle as indicated in the respective MOU's.
- 504001 Social Security/OASDI 6.2 percent of first \$176,100 for all employees.
- 504002 Social Security Medicare 1.45 percent of salary for all employees.
- 504003 PTS Plan FICA Alternative Specifically for part-time, temporary, or seasonal employees who are required to contribute to a Section 457 tax-qualified retirement plan in lieu of making contributions to Social Security.
- 505001 Retirement PERS The total contribution for regular full-time City employees under the 2.5 @ 55 and 3 @ 50 retirement plans.
- 505002 Retirement PERS The total contribution for regular full-time City employees under the 2 @ 60 and 3 @ 55 retirement plans.
- 505003 Retirement PERS The total contribution for regular full-time City employees under the 2 @ 62 and 2.7 @ 57 retirement plans.
- 506001 Unemployment Insurance Fund provides unemployment compensation for employees who have left the City service and qualify under applicable state law.
- 506101 Core Allowance-The City's contribution to the Cafeteria Allowance for each employee's health and welfare benefit insurance coverage costs.
- 506102 Worker's Compensation provides benefits to all active employees for any work-related accident or illness or death as defined by the California Labor Code.
- 506110 Post Employment Benefits -The City's contribution for retiree's health benefit insurance coverage costs.

511002	Telephone - Monthly service charges and long-distance telephone expenses.
511003	Postage and Mailing – General office postage and freight.
511004	Printing - forms, business cards, newsletters, flyers, and other materials
511005	Office Supplies - Expenses for letterhead, envelopes, folders, and other miscellaneous office and computer supplies.
511007	Office Equipment Maintenance - Maintenance of office equipment other than computers and related items.
511008	Electronic, Tech & Other Equipment - Technology equipment costing less than \$5,000 such as laptops, desktop computers, tablets, monitors, hands-free devices, cell phones, charging cords, and protective equipment for them.
511009	Software - Software costing less than \$5,000, such as timekeeping software, Tvalue, Microsoft and Adobe licenses or software that is unique to your area

- 511021 Travel and Meetings Transportation costs, meals and lodging incurred for conferences, meetings and training, and costs of conducting meetings.
- 511038 Community Support Payments to program participants, or community organization, such as, mentees to incentivize them to continue participation in the program; include payments to citizens for generalized or specific support under various programs and contracted services through sub-recipient agreement generally funded through state and federal gnats.
- 511040 Housing Acquis, Build & Rehab Cost to acquire land or buildings for housing and rehabilitation costs.
- 511041 Chemicals Cost to acquire chemicals.
- 511042 Outside Legal Services payments to attorneys for legal fees.
- 511301 Non-operating Materials & Supplies Cost to acquire items that are not in the normal course of business, such as, certificates, items of recognition, retro fees, Valley Coffee, and water/coffee service.
- 547001 Department Share of Insurance -- Department's share of premium and reserve coverage for property, general liability, fidelity bond, and auto insurance. Each type of liability coverage is first assigned a portion of liability administration and reserve costs based on premium value. The combined total of premium, reserve, and administration is then distributed as described below:

General Liability and Fidelity - Costs are distributed based on number of employees.

Property -- Costs are distributed first on the basis of value. Costs attributable to the Civic Center are further allocated based on square footage.

Auto - Costs of auto insurance are distributed based on number of vehicles assigned to departments.

- 547004 Vehicle Operations/Maintenance Vehicle operation and maintenance charges based on vehicle(s) assigned to department.
- 547005 Vehicle Replacement Funds accumulated for vehicle replacement based on vehicle(s) assigned to department.
- 547006 Facilities Maintenance Charge calculations of the Facilities Operations and Maintenance operating budget are distributed by square footage of facilities where service is provided, labor cost based on number of hours service is provided, and direct costs associated with specific department/divisions.

- 547007 Computer Replacement Charge Funds accumulated for the replacement of the computers assigned to department.
- 547009 Support Services This line item is used to distribute the costs of services of the Personnel, Information Systems, and Risk Management Administration. Total costs of each division are reduced by revenues, including interdepartmental direct service charges. The remaining costs are then distributed by a weighted formula based on share of total employees, share of total operating budgets, and estimated percent of time expended by charging department.
- 52XXXX Administrative Expense This line item is used to distribute the costs of services of the City Council, City Manager's office, City Attorney, Finance, Purchasing, Police, and Public Works Administration. Total costs of each division are reduced by other revenues and interdepartmental direct service charges. The remaining costs are then distributed by a weighted formula based on share of total employees, share of total operating budgets, and estimated percent of time expended by charging department. This line item (5X4.91-00) is also used to distribute cost associated with copy machines located in the Civic Center based on historical usage.
- 53XXXX Interdepartmental Direct Service Charges Charges for specific assistance provided by other City departments. Specific amounts are shown On-Line Item Detail pages.
- 590XXX Machinery/Equipment Acquisitions, generally in excess of \$5,000. See detail list in Tab 15 for specific department acquisitions.
- 591XXX Capital Land, buildings, and improvements included in the Five-Year Capital Improvement Program and Vehicle Replacements and Acquisitions. See detailed list in Tab 15 for summary of specific department capital projects and vehicle replacement.
