

# Great Lakes adds more flights to Los Angeles



This month Great Lakes Airlines expands the number of daily flights to Los Angeles International Airport (LAX).

Now there are two flights a day to LAX and another flight to Las Vegas leaving from Merced Regional Airport.

The new flight schedule has the first plane leaving earlier, at 6 a.m.

The early morning departure allows the business traveler an easier time making connecting flights for transcontinental travel. And, it gives them more time to spend doing business in southern California.

Los Angeles International is the third busiest airport in the country, and the sixth busiest in the world.

LAX offers more than 600 daily flights to 91 cities in the U.S. and

more than 1,000 non-stop flights to 58 cities in 32 countries.

It has almost 75 different air carriers and last year more than 61 million passengers went through the terminal.

Merced Regional Airport is the only airport in the county offering passenger service. It is the base for the County's Medi-Flight air ambulance service, and also FedEx. There are 125 planes based at the airport, ranging from small single engine aircraft to corporate jets.

## Ask the City: Why three copies of booklet?

Ask the City is an ongoing column answering questions that have been submitted to us by mail, email or phone. Readers can submit their questions to the addresses in the column on the left.

Why did I get three copies of the "Notice of Proposed Water Rate Changes" booklet? And are you raising the water rates because you are running out of money?

The water division is NOT running out of money. Rates for metered customers are going down, but rates for flat-rate users are going up because they are using more water.

As for the three copies, every water rate user gets a copy, so the writer must have three different accounts. The cost for the 30,000 booklets required by Proposition 218 was \$28,564, with no general fund money.

The booklet is a requirement due to Proposition 218 approved by voters in 1996. Among the provisions was to make sure voters approved new taxes, but it also affected things like water rates.

Proposition 218 requires that ratepayers Letter from PP be notified of rate changes, hence the book-*Merced* lets. It also requires that all users only get charged for what they use — and no more. By paying more the metered users end up subsidizing the flat-rate users, which is not allowed under Proposition 218.
